

Kahibah Sports Club is committed to reducing water and power used throughout its facilities. As part of this commitment, two heat pump hot water systems have recently been installed to reduce power consumption with the support of the NSW Government's Climate Change Fund.

It is projected that the heat pump systems will save approximately 80 megawatt hours of electricity and 86 tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions in the first 10 years.

Through the program managed by the Department of Environment, Climate Change & Water, Kahibah Sports Club received \$7600 toward the project and invested \$4,335 directly towards the project.

Kahibah Sports Club is committed to reducing their carbon footprint and managing energy saving initiatives. Some of the planned initiatives include energy efficient lighting, reduced lighting wattage, staged air conditioning upgrades and improved technology.
